ENDANGERED
North Atlantic
Right Whale

NORTH ATLANTIC RIGHT WHALE

Stay at least 500 yards away. Do not approach. Any vessel within 500 yards of a right whale must depart immediately at a safe, slow speed. Do not chase or encircle. Never position vessel between a mother and calf.

Where They Live: Northwestern Atlantic with fall calving grounds along South Carolina, Georgia, and northeastern Florida



BOTTLENOSE DOLPHIN

Stay at least 50 yards away. Do not approach. Slow to no-wake speed and place engine in neutral. Do not chase or encircle. Never position vessel between a mother and calf.

Where They Live: Harbors, bays, sounds, and estuaries, as well as near-shore coastal waters and in the open ocean

Sperm Whale

SPERM WHALE

Stay at least 100 yards away. Do not approach. Slow to no-wake speed and place engine in neutral. Do not chase or encircle. Never position vessel between a mother and calf.

Where They Live: Gulf of Mexico and the Atlantic Ocean, primarily offshore

Rice's Whale

RICE'S WHALE

Stay at least 500 yards away. Do not approach. Slow to no-wake speed and place engine in neutral. Do not chase or encircle. Never position vessel between a mother and calf.

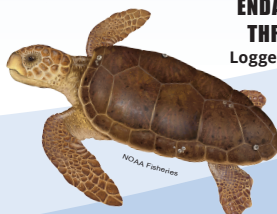
Where They Live: Northeastern Gulf of Mexico along the Continental Shelf

SEA TURTLES

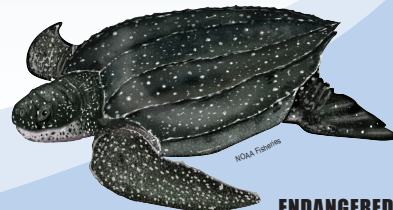
(KEMP'S, LOGGERHEAD, GREEN, HAWKSBILL, & LEATHERBACK)

Stay at least 50 yards away. Do not swim with, chase, touch, or harass sea turtles.

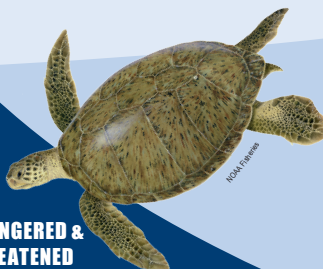
Where They Live: Subtropical and temperate waters of the Atlantic Ocean, Gulf of Mexico, and Caribbean Sea

ENDANGERED
Smalltooth Sawfish

SMALLTOOTH SAWFISH

Do not target when fishing, harm, injure, or kill smalltooth sawfish.

Where They Live: Florida waters (Gulf and Atlantic coasts) primarily observed from Charlotte Harbor through the Everglades, and the Florida Keys

GIANT MANTA RAY

Stay at least 50 yards away. Do not chase, touch, or harass giant manta rays. Do not cast fishing lines at or near manta rays.

Where They Live: Atlantic Ocean, Gulf of Mexico, and Caribbean Sea, primarily offshore, in oceanic waters, and in productive coastal areas

STURGEON

(ATLANTIC, GULF, & SHORTNOSE)

Do not target when fishing, harm, injure or kill Atlantic, Gulf, and shortnose sturgeon.

Where They Live: Atlantic Ocean, Gulf of Mexico, and within estuaries and rivers

OCEANIC WHITETIP SHARK

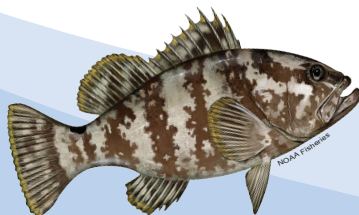
Do not target when fishing, harm, injure, or kill oceanic whitetip sharks.

Where They Live: Atlantic Ocean, Puerto Rico, U.S. Virgin Islands, and South Florida, primarily offshore.

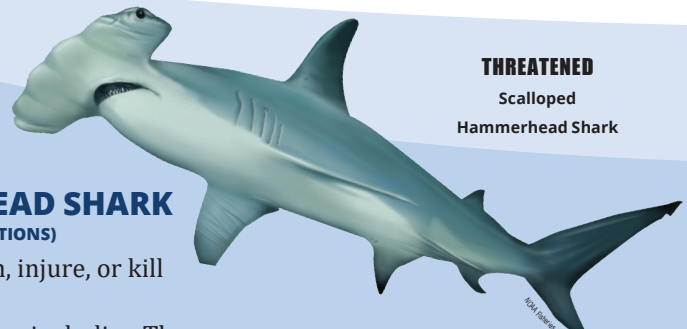
NASSAU GROUPE

Do not target when fishing, harm, injure, or kill Nassau grouper.

Where They Live: Puerto Rico, U.S. Virgin Islands, and South Florida

Scalloped Hammerhead Shark

SCALLOPED HAMMERHEAD SHARK

(CENTRAL & SOUTHWEST ATLANTIC POPULATIONS)

Do not target when fishing, harm, injure, or kill scalloped hammerhead sharks.

Where They Live: Caribbean sea, including The Bahamas, Cuba, and off the coast of Florida
