Re: MMPA Section 120(f)(6)(B) Delegation of Permits to and between Eligible Entities

Dear Chairman Saluskin:

We received your letter, and the Yakama Nation's Tribal Council Resolution T-07-19, dated August 28, 2020, requesting the National Marine Fisheries Service's (NMFS) concurrence with the Confederated Tribes and Bands of the Yakama Nation's (Yakama Nation) delegation of authority to the Columbia River Inter-Tribal Fish Commission (CRITFC) pursuant to section 120(f)(6)(B) of the Marine Mammal Protection Act (MMPA).

On August 14, 2020, NMFS issued a Permit to the eligible entities¹ authorizing the intentional lethal removal of California sea lions and eastern stock of Steller sea lions (sea lions) to reduce or eliminate sea lion predation on certain at-risk fish species in the Columbia River Basin. MMPA section 120(f)(6)(B) permits, with NMFS' approval, certain eligible entities to delegate their removal authority of sea lions to CRITFC.

We concur that your August 28, 2020, letter fulfills the delegation of authority requirements as described in our Procedures to Coordinate Issuance of section 120, subsection (f) Permits of the MMPA (Coordination Procedures) Decision Memorandum (June 4, 2019). We find the Yakama Nation's request is consistent with the MMPA, the applicable Coordination Procedures, and the Permit. We therefore approve the request of the Yakama Nation to delegate their authority to remove sea lions to CRITFC as defined in the Permit and MMPA section 120(f)(6)(B). As a delegate of an eligible entity, CRITFC must comply with all terms and conditions in the August 14, 2020, Permit.
