# **Halibut Careful Release**

All vessels participating in Alaska commercial fisheries <u>MUST CAREFULLY RELEASE ALL</u> **DISCARDED HALIBUT IMMEDIATELY AND WITH A MINIMUM OF INJURY**.

NOAA Fisheries issues this reminder to help reduce halibut discard mortality rates.

#### Careful Release Methods for Hook-and-Line Gear

- Cut the gangion.
- Position the gaff on the hook and twist the hook from the halibut.
- Straighten the hook by using the gaff to catch the bend of the hook and brace the gaff against the vessel or any gear attached to the vessel.

### **Prohibited When Releasing Halibut**

- · Gaff or puncture a halibut.
- Crucify or otherwise strip a halibut from the hook by contact with the vessel.

## **Best Practices to Minimize Injury**

- Release off/outboard as soon as possible: i.e. immediately, or after providing to observer upon request.
- Use both hands to cradle the fish, do not lift solely by the caudal peduncle (pictured, right).



Careful release regulations are available at 50 CFR 679.7(a)(13) for directed fishing for groundfish, and at 50 CFR 300.62 and IPHC for directed fishing for halibut.

#### Failure to comply with these requirements may result in penalties.
