2023 Pacific Whiting Harvest Specifications and 2023 Tribal Allocation

The final rule implementing the 2023 Pacific whiting harvest specifications and the 2023 tribal allocation for Pacific whiting was published, became effective, on May 31, 2023.

This final rule implements the Pacific whiting U.S. TAC of 461,750 mt. The rule also establishes the tribal and non-tribal allocation and a set-aside for research and incidental mortality in other fisheries, as shown below.
