Alaska has more coastline than all of the other states' coastlines combined. The marine habitat of this coastline is in pristine condition. The nutrient rich water is ideal for mariculture. Alaska is in many ways the future for mariculture development in the United States.

Please consider including the state waters of Alaska as an Aquaculture Opportunity Area (AOA) for the cultivation of oysters and seaweeds. The states long term commitment to the ocean ranching of salmon need not interfere with Alaska being designated as an AOA.
