Dear Chairman Sullivan:

Thank you for your January and September 2020 letters requesting a determination of a commercial fishery failure due to a fishery resource disaster for the Port Gamble S'Klallam Tribe's 2014 and 2019 Fraser River sockeye and 2019 Puget Sound chum and coho salmon fisheries.

The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) evaluated information from the Pacific States Marine Fisheries Commission and the tribe to assess your request. After reviewing the information, I have found that the request for a commercial fishery failure determination for the fisheries meets the requirements under section 312(a) of the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation and Management Act.

This determination now makes the fisheries eligible for fishery disaster assistance. Using Congressionally appropriated funds, I have allocated \$551,150 to address the impacts of this fishery disaster event on the tribe. NMFS will be following up with you and the Pacific States Marine Fisheries Commission to assist in the development of your spend plan.
