

Fishery Management



Maintain healthy fish stocks important to commercial, recreational, and subsistence sectors of fisheries, and provide safe, sustainable seafood

Protected Resources



Conserve and recover marine mammals and other endangered and threatened species (corals, turtles, sawfish, sturgeon, sharks, rays, Nassau grouper...)

Habitat



Avoid, minimize and mitigate habitat loss, and enhance and/or restore habitat

Marine Aquaculture



Support opportunities to meet growing demand for seafood with sustainable aquaculture

Key Terms: Equity

Equity means the consistent and systematic fair, just, and impartial treatment of all individuals, including individuals who belong to underserved communities that have been denied such treatment.



Key Terms: Environmental Justice

Environmental Justice is the fair treatment and meaningful involvement of all people, regardless of race, color, gender, national origin, or income, with respect to the development, implementation, and enforcement of environmental laws, regulations, and policies including but not limited to:

- Equitable protection from environmental and health hazards
- Equitable access to decision-making processes
- Equitable opportunity for disadvantaged communities that have been historically marginalized

Key Terms: Underserved Communities

Underserved communities have been systematically denied a full opportunity to participate in aspects of economic, social, and civic life.



These include geographic communities as well as populations sharing a particular characteristic such as: women and girls; Black, Latino, and Indigenous and Native American persons*, Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders, and other persons of color; persons facing discrimination or barriers related to gender identity; members of religious minorities; lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and queer (LGBTQ+) persons; persons with disabilities; persons who live in rural areas; and persons otherwise adversely affected by persistent poverty or inequality.


