National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration Atlantic Sharks, Tunas, Billfish, and Swordfish Art Contest Opens October 18, 2023

CONTEST RULES

Each entry must be composed of a piece of artwork and a title. **All must meet the requirements below.** A NOAA awards panel will collect all entries and select 13 winners to be featured in an <u>Atlantic highly migratory species</u> (sharks, tuna, billfish, and swordfish) calendar. Entries will be judged on the creativity, artistic presentation, and relevance to the art contest theme.

The theme of the 2024 HMS art contest is Atlantic tunas. The winning artwork will be featured in a 2025 Atlantic tunas calendar.

The artwork should highlight:

- 1. The important role Atlantic tunas play in their ecosystem to support healthy oceans;
- 2. The diversity of Atlantic tunas and their habitats; and/or
- 3. Unique biological characteristics of Atlantic tunas.

Eligibility - All students in kindergarten through eighth grade from all U.S. states and territories enrolled in public, private, and home schools are eligible to participate. *Students must work individually*.

ARTWORK & DESCRIPTION REQUIREMENTS

We strongly encourage highlighting federally managed Atlantic tunas, which include Atlantic bluefin, bigeye, albacore, yellowfin, and skipjack tunas, so the calendar reflects the wide range of Atlantic tuna species found in the Atlantic Ocean.

- 1. Provide one entry per student.
- 2. Create artwork on a single sheet of <u>8.5" x 11" paper</u>, <u>landscape</u>.
- 3. Use white, non-glossy paper; do not laminate.
- 4. Use any art medium (e.g., colored pencils, crayons, paint). Artwork must be hand-drawn by the student.
- 5. Ensure artwork is flat (e.g., no glued pieces or glitter) and able to be scanned.
- 6. Avoid labeling items with any brand names, slogans, or personal information in the artwork; limit text on the artwork.
- 7. Provide a title for the artwork (space provided on the entry form).
- 8. Label each mail entry on the back in pencil (marker bleeds through the artwork) with the student's name, grade, school, and state.
- 9. If submitting electronically, <u>accepted file types are: JPEG, PNG, or TIFF</u>. Make sure files are high resolution (scanning is encouraged), not crooked, and easy to see and/or read.

SUBMITTING ENTRIES

All entries (entry form and artwork) must be submitted by mail (postmarked) or sent electronically no later than January 31, 2024. There should be one entry form filled out per student. Please ensure that the entry form is filled out completely and legibly.
