


## Proposed Rule to Set Atlantic Bluefin Tuna General Category Effort Controls and Related Regulations

#### Purpose and Need for Action

- Establish schedule for all future Atlantic bluefin tuna (BFT) restricted-fishing days (RFDs)
- Establish a General category default daily retention limit for large medium or giant BFT on open days
- Clarify existing HMS dealer regulations and the definition of a bluefin statistical document (BSD) tag





#### What is an RFD?

- A day on which NOAA Fisheries sets the BFT retention limit at zero for certain permit categories
- An effort control used to lengthen the amount of time it takes to fill the General category time period subquotas
- RFD schedule is established ahead of time, currently through annual rulemaking

#### On an RFD:

- Atlantic Tunas General category permitted vessels are prohibited from fishing for (including catch-and-release and tag-and-release), possessing, retaining, landing, or selling BFT
- Highly Migratory Species (HMS) Charter/Headboat permitted vessels with a commercial sale endorsement are prohibited from fishing commercially for BFT
- HMS Charter/Headboat permitted vessels can fish recreationally under Angling category restrictions and retention limits



# Proposed Measure – General category RFD Schedule (*Preferred Alternative B1*)

- RFD schedule would be set in the regulations (i.e., remain the same annually unless changed) every Tuesday, Friday, and Saturday July 1 – November 30
- NOAA Fisheries may remove or establish additional RFDs, as appropriate, through further rulemaking
- Other alternatives considered:
  - *Alternative A (Status-quo)*: Keep current regulations for RFDs
  - Alternative B2: Set an RFD schedule of three days per week (Thursday, Friday, and Saturday)
  - Alternative B3: Set an RFD schedule of three days per week (Friday, Saturday, and Sunday)
  - *Alternative B4*: Set an RFD schedule of four days or more per week from July 1 to November 30
  - *Alternative C*: Eliminate RFDs

Note: All of the red "X" days are proposed RFDs. Under the proposed rule, landing and selling BFT *commercially* could only happen on the days that do not have a red "X". **The same Tuesday, Friday, and Saturday schedule would apply in all future years**.



#### Waiving RFDs

- NOAA Fisheries may waive an RFD via closure of the General category time period(s)
- NOAA Fisheries may waive an RFD under certain circumstances including:
  - Review of dealer reports
  - Daily landing trends
  - Availability of BFT on fishing grounds
- NOAA Fisheries would announce any waiver via a retention limit adjustment in the Federal Register
- NOAA Fisheries would <u>not</u> modify previously scheduled RFDs during the fishing year in other ways, including:
  - Changing an RFD from one date to another
  - Adding RFDs



# Proposed Measure – General category default daily retention limits (*Preferred Alternative D3*)

Establish two default retention limits:

- 3 large medium or giant BFT per day/trip on open days in June
- 1 large medium or giant BFT per day/trip on open days during all other months when the fishery is open (*i.e.*, *January through March and July through December; the General category BFT fishery is not open during the months of April and May*)
- Other alternatives considered:
  - *Alternative D1 (Status-quo):* No default retention limit
  - Alternative D2: Establish a default daily retention limit of 1 BFT per day/trip



# Proposed Regulatory Clarification of Dealer Activities on RFDs

In recent years, we have received questions and concerns about dealer requirements relative to General category RFDs. These include:

- Questions on the timing of transfer and sale of a BFT to a dealer
- Questions on the timing of affixing a dealer tag
- Questions on who can act as a dealer's agent for the purposes of tagging a commercially landed BFT when a dealer is unavailable to first receive BFT on that day





### Proposed Regulatory Clarification of Dealer Activities on RFDs (cont.)

- To address these ongoing questions and concerns and assist enforcement of RFDs, NOAA Fisheries is proposing to clarify:
  - BFT that are intended for sale must be in the possession of a permitted dealer no later than 2400 hours local time the day prior to an RFD
  - On an RFD, a dealer or dealer's agent may not purchase or place a dealer tag on a BFT that is on or has been offloaded from an Atlantic Tunas General category or HMS Charter/Headboat category permitted vessel, regardless of when the fish was landed
  - A dealer or dealer's agent must affix a dealer tag to each BFT purchased or first received from a U.S. vessel immediately upon offloading the BFT
  - A dealer's agent is a person who is currently employed by a place of business covered by the dealer's permit
  - Definition of a BSD tag

Note: On an RFD, a dealer or dealer's agent may continue to first receive, place dealer tags on, or purchase BFT from vessels with other Atlantic Tunas permits (i.e., Harpoon, Longline, Trap)
