NOAA's Office of Law Enforcement is seeking information to help identify those responsible for the stabbing of a elephant seal pup on the beach at Neskowin, Oregon on March 16th.



The incident took place in a cove in front of the Proposal Rock Condominiums on Sunday, March 16, between 8 p.m. and 11:30 p.m.

The young elephant seal sustained multiple stab wounds, but survived.

Callers can leave tips anonymously.

Harassing, harming, killing or feeding wild elephant seals is prohibited by the Marine Mammal Protection Act. Violations can be prosecuted civilly or criminally and are punishable by up to \$100,000 in fines and up to 1 year in jail per violation.

A person of interest has been identified and is described as a white male, approximately 5 feet 10 inches, with a standard build, black and white hair, a groomed beard, and large gap between his front teeth.

Investigators are also seeking the owner of a vehicle seen in the parking lot behind the condominiums that may be associated with the person of interest. The vehicle was described as:

- Dark blue 1990s Dodge or Chrysler van
- Rear passenger window on driver's side covered in plastic
- Inside of the vehicle appeared "cluttered"
